According to CMS.gov, in July 2018, CMS finalized a new case-mix classification model, the Patient Driven Payment Model (PDPM), that, effective beginning October 1st, 2019, will be used under the Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Prospective Payment System (PPS) for classifying SNF patients in a covered Part A stay. This course will analyze the new model and provide education on how to assist healthcare professionals in preparing for PDPM implementation.

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Objectives
