The Kansas Immunization Conference 2019 will focus attention on a growing concern—vaccine hesitancy. Vaccines can only improve health and prevent deaths if they are used so hesitancy is an increasingly important challenge facing immunization providers. Session content has been created to provide practical information to increase acceptance of vaccines, share effective practices, and develop new tools to assess and address hesitancy. Conference breakout sessions will provide the opportunity to learn from their peers' experiences across the continuum of vaccine administration. Participants will also hear personal stories that address vaccine hesitancy and vaccine preventable disease.

The popular preconference sessions will again provide participants with the opportunity to interact with Kansas Immunization Program staff in an informal setting.



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## Objectives

At the conclusion of the conference participants should be able to:

- Evaluate their current approach utilized with vaccine hesitant patients and families to identify opportunities for improvement.
- Discuss factors that can be linked to vaccine hesitancy.
- Develop effective communication strategies regarding vaccine efficacy and safety.
- Identify strategies used by peers throughout the state to address vaccine related challenges.
- Describe the changes to childhood, adolescent and adult immunization schedules.

Physicians, physician assistants, advanced practice nurses, nurses and other health professionals interested in advocating for healthy lives by offering age and culturally-appropriate messages as well as scientifically-based vaccine delivery.

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## Featured Speakers

### **Sharon G. Humiston, M.D., MPH, FAAP**



*Department of Pediatrics/Division of Emergency Medicine, Children's Mercy Kansas City; Professor of Pediatrics, The University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Medicine*

Dr. Humiston is a professor of pediatrics, University of Missouri-Kansas City and a clinician and researcher in the Division of Emergency and Urgent Care at Children's Mercy Hospitals and Clinics in Kansas City,

Missouri. Dr. Humiston is also the associate director for research at the Immunization Action Coalition and a member of the Vaccine Education Center Advisory Board at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

### **Peter J. Hotez M.D., Ph.D., FAAP**



*Dean of the National School of Tropical Medicine; Professor of Pediatrics and Molecular Virology and Microbiology, Baylor College of Medicine*

Dr. Hotez is Dean of the National School of Tropical Medicine and Professor of Pediatrics and Molecular Virology & Microbiology at Baylor College of Medicine where he is also the Director of the Texas Children's

Center for Vaccine Development (CVD) and Texas Children's Hospital Endowed Chair of Tropical Pediatrics. He is also University Professor at Baylor University, and Fellow in Disease and Poverty at the James A Baker III Institute for Public Policy, as well as the Health Policy Scholar in the Baylor Center for Medical Ethics and Health Policy.

Dr. Hotez is an internationally-recognized physician-scientist in neglected tropical diseases and vaccine development. As head of the Texas Children's CVD, he leads the only product development partnership for developing new vaccines for hookworm infection, schistosomiasis, leishmaniasis, Chagas disease, and SARS/MERS, diseases affecting hundreds of millions of children and adults worldwide.

Dr. Hotez has authored more than 450 original papers and is the author of *Forgotten People, Forgotten Diseases* (ASM Press) and *Blue Marble Health: An Innovative Plan to Fight Diseases of the Poor amid Wealth* (Johns Hopkins University Press).

Most recently as both a vaccine scientist and autism Dad he has led national efforts to defend vaccines and to serve as an ardent champion of vaccines going up against a growing national "antivaxx" threat. His newest book, *Vaccines Did Not Cause Rachel's Autism* (Johns Hopkins Press) will be released this fall. Dr. Hotez appears frequently on television (including BBC, CNN, Fox News, and MSNBC), radio, and in newspaper interviews (including the New York Times, USA Today, Washington Post, and Wall Street Journal).

### **Pamela Rockwell, D.O., FAFP**



*Associate Professor Department of Family Medicine, University of Michigan*

Dr. Rockwell is an associate professor in the University of Michigan Medical School Department of Family Medicine with fellowship training in Vaccine Science through the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP). She sits on the board of the Michigan Academy of Family Physicians and is an

active member of the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine. Dr. Rockwell is a practicing family physician with over 20 years' clinical experience with administrative responsibilities as medical director at Domino Farms Family Medicine.

At a national level, she is AAFP liaison to the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and serves as AAFP liaison to the ACIP work groups on Hepatitis, General Recommendations, and Pediatric and Adult RSV. She leads the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine Group on Immunization Education and helped develop an app called SHOTS Immunizations, free for smart phones.

### **Amanda Applegate, PharmD, BCACP**



*Pharmacy Clinical Services Coordinator, Balls Foods Stores; President, Kansas Pharmacist Association*

Amanda Applegate, PharmD, BCACP, graduated from the University of Kansas School of Pharmacy and completed her residency with KU and Balls Food Stores. She is currently the pharmacy clinical services coordinator for Balls Food Stores in the Kansas City

metro area, managing immunizations, medication therapy management, and grant projects for 20 pharmacies. She also works with patients with diabetes and/or cardiovascular disease through the Start Now patient self-management program. Amanda is currently serving as President of the Kansas Pharmacists Association. She is an adjunct clinical assistant professor with the KU School of Pharmacy and precepts pharmacy residents and students at Balls Foods.

### **Maggi Pivovar**



*Vaccine-Preventable Disease Survivor*

In 2007, at age 37, Maggi contracted what appeared to be a flu-like illness. It was far worse. First given 30 minutes to live, and then a 98% chance to die, bacterial meningitis nearly took her life in just 20 hours and devastated her family. She will share her story including how she would like to have known how preventable this disease is.

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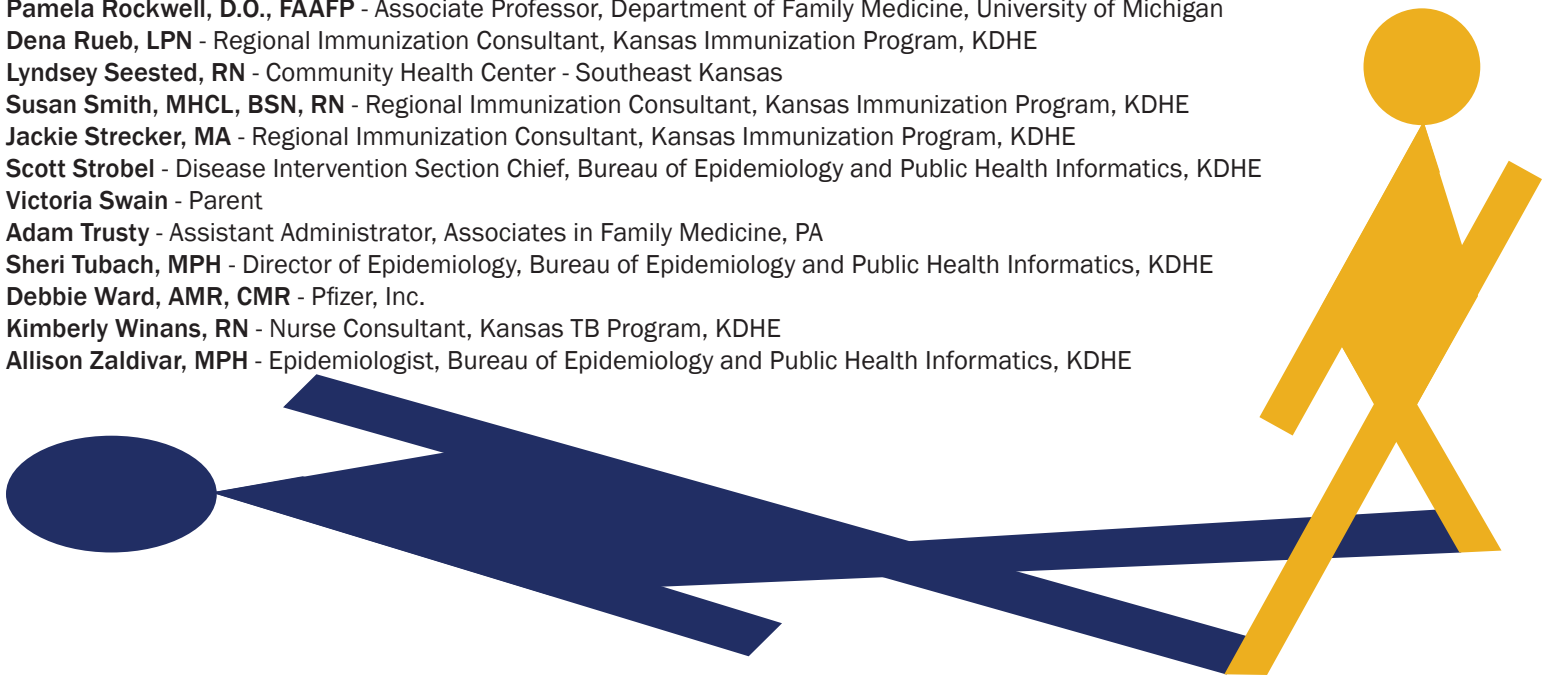

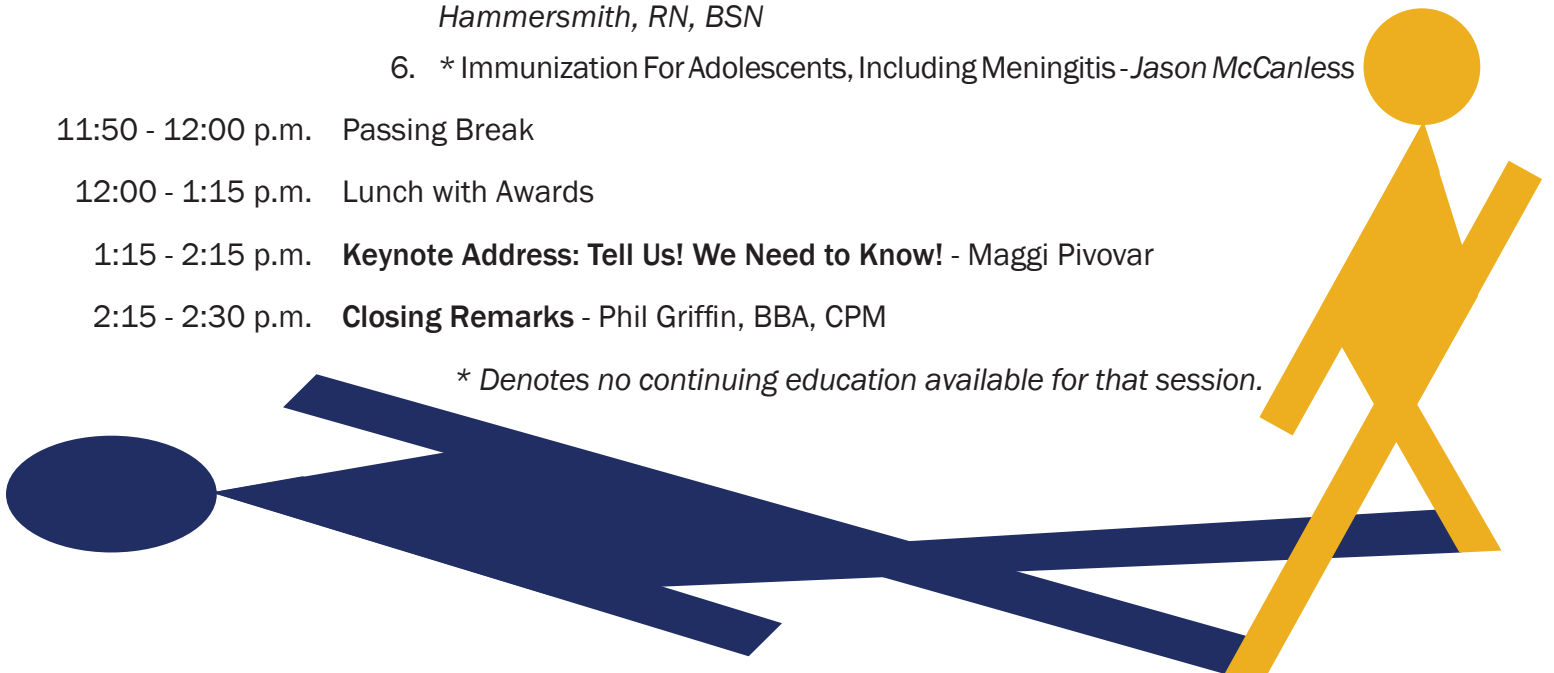
