### What is this program about?

This conference is designed to promote the professional development of the nurse educator. The Clinical Teaching Institute (day one) will provide workshops designed to build knowledge and skills in utilizing the NextGEN cognitive model to design test items, classroom activities, and consider opportunities for integration of the model into clinical activities and evaluation. Day 2 will focus on the topic of resilience and the potential to build and cultivate it within the nursing education setting. Day 3 will focus on the use of socratic questioning in building critical thinking skills in nursing students. Participants may also choose three concurrent sessions in the day three afternoon program. Throughout the conference educators will have the opportunity to network with colleagues.

**Teresa Stephens, Ph.D., M.S.N., RN, CNE**  
Founder, RN P.R.E.P.



Teresa "Tese" Stephens, Ph.D., M.S.N., RN, CNE is a nurse educator, researcher, and consultant with 35 years experience in both practice and academic settings, from adjunct faculty to Dean. She is the author of Stephens' Model of Resilience and the founder of RN P.R.E.P. (Personal Resilience Enhancement Plan). Her research is focused on RESILIENCE, specifically as a tool to promote well-being and professional fulfillment in nurses, nursing students, and other clinicians, with an emphasis on the radical transformation of academia. Much of this work is built upon the narratives of Holocaust survivors. She is a Certified Nurse Educator (CNE) and serves as a consultant, advisor, and member of several professional organizations, task forces, and work groups. She received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from East Tennessee State University, her Master of Science in Nursing from King College, a post-graduate certificate in nursing education from the University of Tennessee, and her Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Tennessee. She is the author of multiple publications and book chapters and a frequent presenter at regional, national, and international conferences and workshops.

**Christine Sorrell Dinkins, Ph.D.**

Kenan Professor of Philosophy, Wofford College



Dinkins holds a Ph.D. in philosophy with a specialization in Socratic method from Johns Hopkins University. She is the Kenan Professor of Philosophy at Wofford College in South Carolina, where she teaches courses in Ancient Philosophy and Philosophy of Medicine with an emphasis on ethics. She is co-editor of *Listening to the Whispers: Re-thinking Ethics in Healthcare*. Her current scholarship focuses on empathy and ethics in nursing education. She consults as a curriculum designer and workshop facilitator for Socratic method in a variety of nurse education contexts.
