## OVERVIEW

### Hands-on workshop on Friday, April 26, 2019

The hands-on workshop is aimed to provide an opportunity to the participants to familiarize themselves with the various endoscopic tools and practice different therapeutic endoscopy techniques under the direct supervision of our esteemed faculty. This will include ablation, endoscopic resection, esophageal and biliary stenting, clipping and suturing, hemostasis, cholangioscopy and axios, and other new technologies. The expert faculty will demonstrate these endoscopic techniques as well as the devices and accessories used. Participants will be divided into small groups to practice skills and techniques within their scope of responsibility relating to the various procedures. There will be opportunity for the participants to ask questions from the faculty and to practice and refine their technique in these various procedures. This session will be open to all participants including gastroenterologists, trainees, nurses and health technicians.

### Live Endoscopy course on Saturday, April 27, 2019

The purpose of this course is to provide a state-of-the-art update on advancements in diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopy, along with lectures on current topics in GI and hepatology, to health professionals in the greater Midwest region. Attendees will learn about various endoscopic techniques and technological innovations in the field of gastrointestinal endoscopy that can be incorporated in their clinical practice. Through a series of didactic lectures, video forum and live endoscopy cases, the basic and advanced techniques in therapeutic endoscopy will be reviewed by experts in the field.

## TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for gastroenterologists, gastroenterology fellows, gastroenterology nurses, GI nurse practitioners and health technicians.

## OBJECTIVES

At the completion of course, participants should be able to:

- Practice acquired skills, within your scope of responsibility, using endoscopic diagnostic tools for ablation, endoscopic resection, esophageal and biliary stenting, clipping and suturing, and hemostasis to improve accuracy in making diagnoses and describing post-procedure care through hands-on workshops.
- Discuss and implement treatment of bloating and dyspepsia
- Diagnose and manage refractory esophageal stricture
  - ♦ Nurses – Recognize the nurses' role in follow up care of refractory esophageal stricture
- Manage achalasia
- Institute optimum therapy for chronic hepatic C
- Describe non-alcoholic fatty liver disease and how to effectively manage
- Define and treat drug-induced liver injury
- Recognize the surveillance colonoscopy guidelines and the controversies
- Optimally manage patients with Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis
- Implement techniques to cannulate the bile duct
  - ♦ Nurses – Optimize post-procedure care following cannulation of the bile duct
- Demonstrate how to remove large colon polyps effectively
  - ♦ Nurses – Describe post-procedure care following large colon polyp removal
- Recognize the role of endoscopic ultrasound (EUS) in therapeutic endoscopy

# Kansas City Live Endoscopy Course & Update in Gastroenterology and Hepatology 2019
