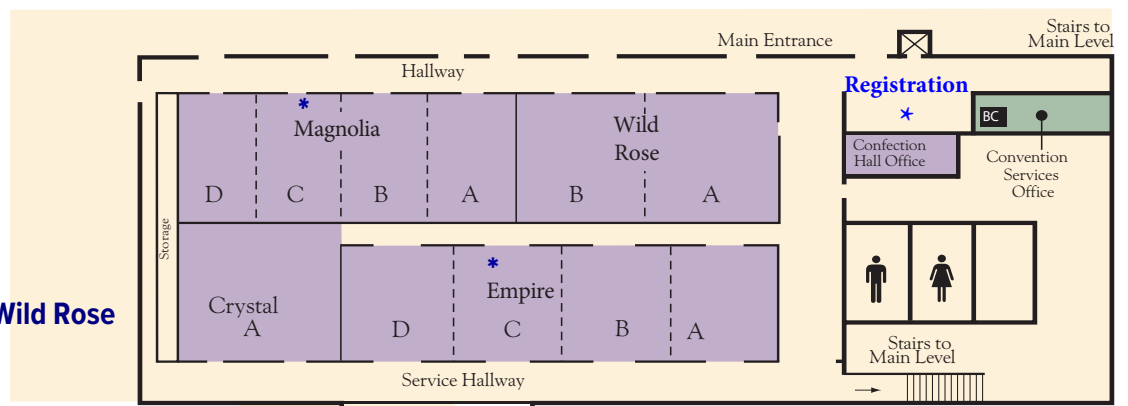


Confection Hall Level
