- Integrate a collaborative approach with OB/GYN faculty, midwives and L&D department staff to avoid patient complications and delay in care.
- Identify key areas that hinder successful operations of our FM OB Faculty by utilizing process improvement strategies and team based learning.
- Assess faculty confidence in their management and care of OB patients in the inpatient and outpatient setting to guide initiatives for quality improvement and ongoing learning.
